Old Business

1. Reports: Road I Course in Spokane
 - a. Jen, Scott, Linda, and Corrie attended the League of American Cyclists Road I course taught by Eileen Hyatt in Spokane during May. Course covered the basics of the bicycle, clothing, rules of the road and included actual riding in downtown Spokane in various traffic situations. These four intend to take the \$250 seminar within the year to become certified cycle instructors.
2. Reports: Wellness Fair
 - a. Lots of folks stopped by. Not many were into cycling. Some had bikes; most had excuses. The city provided lunch for presenters. Worth doing.
3. Reports: Jen's Classes coming up on the 24th and 30th
 - a. No report. Jen wasn't present. Several people had enquired.
4. Breakheart Trial. Bill Mannshreck has given us dates he'd be available to lead a hike on this trail. We need to select one and get back to him. July 12, 19, June 7, 14, May 31
 - a. We selected July 19th. Corrie will get in touch with Bill to get more information for start, stop, time, car-pooling. We should put a public notice in the Tribune for this day hike.
 - b. To put the club on record as supporting a rails to trails conversion we should put the question to a vote of the membership

5. [Bite The Bullet Day Tour](#): Corrie 68 miles and 4000 feet of climbing. Not an easy day ride. We do have Leann Tibbals committed for the 29th of June, a Sunday.

New Business

1. **PayPal Membership Page: Corrie**

- a. I have set up a club PayPal account and tested it by paying the club 1. It shows up as .65 cents because PayPal charges no fees unless you use the account. The fee for use is 2.9% of the item cost plus 30 cents for each transaction.
 - b. I have prepared a [membership page](#) reflecting an increased cost for using Paypal.
 - c. We can use Paypal to take payment for other transactions such as Joseph Shirts, Devil's Slide, extra socks and shirts
 - d. **Motion:** I propose we make the page available for those who prefer paying online. The motion passed.
2. **Joseph Shirts:**
- a. Last year's shirt was popular both for design and fabric. We want to offer shirts again this year. Debbie will follow up. She says it is important that people order the first time. It is very difficult to get enough orders for a second run of shirts.
 - b. Corrie says we could set up PayPal to pay for the shirts up front
3. **Scheduling New rides**
- a. Sunday 1pm starts will continue through June unless the weather turns hot.
 - b. June 5th, Thursday Time Trial becomes Senior Games competition. Any one may ride, but if you are 50 or older you may register on site to compete in the Senior Games's only cycling event.
 - c. June 8th, Saturday Bike and Brew from El Sombrero 10 am start. Celebrates Mike's Birthday. 58 mile ride.
 - d. June 10th, Tuesday Linda leads an **Easy Does It Ride** on the Trail of the Coeur d'Alenes from Heyburn State Park. Details to come. 20 miles or so of flat, lake view cycling.
 - e. June 14th Saturday on the Southfork. Start in Kamiah at 8 and ride up Harpster to Grangeville and back down Mt. Idaho along the Southfork of the Clearwater back to Kamiah. Option to climb the forested switchbacks of the Old White Bird Grade before going down Mt. Idaho.
 - f. June 22nd, Sunday Kendrick ride starting at 10 am from the Southway boat launch.
 - g. June 28th, Saturday Breakfast Run. Bike to Mainstreet Grill in downtown Lewiston for breakfast at 9 am. Then bike home or form up groups to extend your ride. This should be the first of a series of breakfast runs.
4. **Discussion: Corrie: Pay sag drivers up front?**
- a. Given the cost of gas and the necessity of having SAG at rides like Joseph and Huckleberry, we need a more equitable system of identifying who qualifies as SAG and what remuneration would be. Tips would still be appropriate. Proposal to use a per mile figure and pay per vehicle rather than driver was tabled for further discussion.
